
Grace and peace to you, and welcome!

TODAY IN WORSHIP

Welcome to worship on this sixth Sunday of Easter as our congregation is honoring our youth. We are glad you are worshipping with us and pray you will experience the grace of God's welcome and be spiritually refreshed and socially reoriented for the week ahead. Today through the lens of the lectionary texts for today, Acts 16:9-15, and John 14:23-29, you are invited to reflect on the significance of Jesus' "going away" but also how he is "coming to us."

All children are welcome to stay in worship throughout the service but may leave after Scott offers a message for young disciples at the end of the welcome and announcements. Childcare is also provided in the nursery by Louna Esperance and Saturnina Greeves-Cooper from <u>8:45-11:30 am every Sunday</u>. There are also curriculum bags for kids and a craft corner in the rear of the sanctuary if anyone gets restless. Church-wide events hosted by the YLC are inclusive of all ages! Continue to watch the FPCNC event schedule and sign up to explore faith and share in fellowship with our wonderful inter-generational church family.

FPCNC is staying steady with "mask optional" policy in worship, at church gatherings, and on church grounds. Fully vaccinated individuals are no longer required to wear masks, although those who prefer to may continue to do so. The in-person Sunday service will continue to be simultaneously streamed online via *LocalLive* at 10:00 am.

Large Print Hymns available: It has been mentioned to the Worship Committee that as much as we love the new hymnals, for some it might be easier to read the hymns and music with a larger font. Each Sunday a copy of the large font hymns that we are singing that week will be available – just ask an usher for the "Blue Hymn Folder". After worship, please leave the hymn folder with an usher or on the table in the back of the Sanctuary.

ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

Dan Locklair composed *Rubrics* during the spring of 1988 in Winston-Salem, North Carolina on a commission from the Organ Artist Series of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania for their tenth anniversary year celebration (culmination on April 16, 1989, with the world premiere of *Rubrics* in Pittsburgh by the American organist, Mary Preston). The piece is a Liturgical Suite for organ in five movements. The extra-musical impetus and subsequent titles for each movement are found in the instructions (rubrics) to the services for *The Book Of Common Prayer* (September 1979).

Our FPCNC Choir and Jennifer O'Neill will offer **Charles Ives**' arrangement of the spiritual *In the Mornin*' this morning. Ives composed church solos only in the period of his earliest music, about which he could be understandably reticent. Two have survived, which are free boyish flights: *Rock of Ages* and *Far From My Heav'nly Home*. Both were written (or revised?) for Isabelle Raymond, the contralto at the Danbury Baptist Church, who must have sung one or the other on Ives's last Sunday as organist there, 30 April 1893. *The Danbury News* reported: "The music of the offertory in the morning service, sung by Miss, Raymond, was a particularly fine composition. Mr. Ives is its author."

Our Offertory duet was arranged by a friend of mine, **Roosevelt André Credit**. Roo, as he goes by, was born in 1966, my birth year as well. Roo's background in a variety of musical styles has greatly influenced his arrangements. The gospel harmonies coupled with his classical voice training and his love of Jazz and World Music have given his arrangements their unique style. His love for mixing the old with the new can be embraced in his collection. He hopes that his arrangements will transcend all barriers and be performed I both church and concert settings.



GROW IN FAITH

Sunday Morning Adult Study starts at 8:30 am in the Parlor! Presbyterians are people of faith who are seeking understanding. From the beginnings of our Reformed tradition, we realize God calls us to explore ways the Christian faith can be more fully known and lived. For the Easter season, we will be doing a six-week study on the Apostles' Creed. You've probably noticed that we recite the Apostles' Creed occasionally in worship, and so this is an opportunity to dig a little deeper into the history and meaning of the Creed. Associate Pastor Nominating Committee Update: The FPCNC Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) is made up of co-chairs Charlotte Allen and Brian Lombardi, with Youth Elder Douglas Gillespie, Kristie Godina, Session Elder, Mark Magnusen, and Lynn Jackson Quinn, with Randy Ferguson as HR Liaison and Scott as pastoral liaison. The APNC, elected at the congregational meeting in February, has had a number of meetings to get to know one another, work on the Mission Information Form (MIF) which describes the congregational context and position description, receive training from the Presbytery Committee on Ministry liaison (Shannon White) and General Presbyter (Shannan Vance-Ocampo) on the call process and interview techniques. The APNC has posted the MIF with the Presbyterian "Church Leadership Connection" and is in the process of contacting seminaries and other sites to "get the word out" and alert qualified candidates to our opportunity to serve as the Associate Pastor for Youth and Children's Ministries. The APNC has already received "matches" from the Church Leadership Connection and is beginning to discern which candidates are of interest and to be pursued for interviews. Please pray for the APNC as they continue their work and begin contacting prospective candidates for the interview process. The next steps involve contacting prospective candidates, zoom interviews, personal interviews of final candidates, vetting by the Committee on Ministry, and when a final candidate is discerned, to present to the congregation and a vote to extend a call. It's a substantial process, and we appreciate your patience and prayers for energy, intelligence, imagination, and much love as we proceed. In the coming weeks, we will be reaching out to you for your input, suggestions, and questions. Thank you!

Emergency response to Ukraine war



As the violence in Ukraine continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work. Our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.
