





TODAY IN WORSHIP

Welcome to Worship on this Fourth Sunday after Epiphany (January 6 was the Feast of the Epiphany). This is the Church season in which God's light is revealed in the world. Today we will explore Jesus' first miracle as recorded in Mark, for it tells us about Jesus' ministry and ours. We are glad that you are here and pray you will hear God's Word for you.

All children from Kindergarten age on up are welcome to join us for Sunday School this morning! Children depart the Worship service for Sunday School after the Blessing for Young Disciples. Sunday School is held upstairs in the "piano room" of the Bliss House (at the top of the stairs closest to the Pastor's Study). Adults can meet up with their children in the Common Room immediately following Worship. During the winter quarter, we will be learning about Jesus' life and ministry, the work of his Disciples, and how we can be disciples too!

Children are also warmly welcome to stay in Worship! For children who stay during Worship, the *Pray-Ground* can be found in the area in front of the back pew. The Pray-Ground is a designated place in the Sanctuary where young children can experience Worship through age-appropriate worship materials and tools that will help keep them engaged in what is happening. We will continue to rotate books and coloring materials on an ongoing basis. Although it can seem counter-intuitive to adults, children are often able to process what they hear more effectively when they have something to do with their hands.

Any child worshipping in the Pray-Ground should bring their grown-up with them to the Pray-Ground. Including young children in Worship can sometimes feel a little daunting, especially on days when they're feeling a little extra fidgety, but we don't need to be discouraged from keeping children in the Sanctuary. There are many important things that children learn while in Worship, even when we're not sure if they're paying attention. Young children learn by observing the adults around them. Children acquire the "language" of worship by listening to and observing the words the adults around them say, much like how they learn their native tongue. Quite simply, children learn to worship by regularly being in Worship. So families with little ones should feel free to worship together in the Pray-Ground!

FPCNC also offers **babysitting during our Sunday Service** provided by Saturnina Greeves-Cooper and Lizz Reyes from Wee Care Nanny Agency. Our Nursery is located just off our Common Room vestibule down the long hall from the Sanctuary and is available between the hours of 8:45–11:30am. **Parental and guardian sign-in is required and we do ask that you pick up your child promptly after the Service.**

If you wish to place flowers in the Sanctuary to celebrate an anniversary, baptism, or birthday, or to memorialize a beloved family member or friend, please contact the church office.

ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

Today's organ music is by **Johann Sebastian Bach** (1685-1750), the famous German composer and organist of the Baroque era, whose sacred and secular works for choir, orchestra and keyboard drew together almost all elements of the Baroque style and brought this musical form to its maturity. Bach composed for every musical category of his time except for the genre of opera, and expanded musical composition in format, quality, and technical exactness through harmonizations, fugues, and intricate melodies. Ultimately, Bach's sole aim was to glorify God, as the designation *Soli Deo Gloria* (To God Alone the Glory) was signed on many of his compositions.

Our first choir anthem is composed by **William Levi Dawson** (1899-1990), an American composer, choir director, professor, and musicologist. Dawson ran away from home to study music full-time as a pre-college student at the Tuskegee Institute (now University) under the tutelage of school President Booker T. Washington. Dawson paid his tuition by being a music librarian and manual laborer working in the school's Agricultural Division. He also participated as a member of Tuskegee's choir, band and orchestra, composing and traveling extensively with the Tuskegee Singers for five years; he had learned to play most of the instruments by the time he completed his studies in 1921. Besides chamber music, he is known for his contributions to both orchestral and choral literature. His best-known works are arrangements of and variations on spirituals.

Our offertory anthem is composed by **Alec Rowley** (1892-1958), an English composer, organist, pianist, lecturer and writer on music. He composed a large number of works, mainly on a small scale and often of an educational nature though with some larger-scale orchestral and choral works. He was a dedicated teacher, broadcaster and writer. He entered the Royal Academy of Music in 1908, where he studied under Frederick Corder, H.W. Richards (organ) and Edward Morton (piano). He was elected a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists (FRCO) in 1914, and held a succession of church organist appointments: at St John's, Richmond, 1912–21, St Alban's, Teddington 1921–32 and, during the Second World War, at St Margaret's, Westminster. From 1920 he was a lecturer at Trinity College of Music, later a professor and Fellow of the college. He became well known as a broadcaster during the 1930s, through a series of piano duets with Edgar Moy. From 1939 to 1947 he served as a member of the Royal Philharmonic Society's management committee. He became a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Music (FRAM) in 1934.

I completed my Bachelor's of Music, Classical Vocal Performance at Western Connecticut State University. During my college tenure as a member of WCSU's Opera Ensemble, I performed in *Fille du Regiment* as Tonio, in *Merry Wives of Windsor* as Fenton, and in *Street Scene* as Mr. Buchanan, among others. I have also performed with Charis Chamber Singers and participated in the National Concert Chorus, performing in the Forever Music concert at Carnegie Hall. I was extremely fortunate to participate in the Patti Hagman 2022 Summer Salzburg Festival, where I performed "Tornami a dir che m'ami'" from *Don Pasquale*. I'm excited to be singing with the First Presbyterian Church Choir and looking forward to making music together.





Humanitarian response in Israel/Palestine

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

Our biggest concern is the safety and care for those caught in the middle of this conflict and in need of humanitarian aid, no matter their religious beliefs, politics or nationality.
