TODAY IN WORSHIP

Welcome to worship on this 29th Sunday of "Ordinary Time"! We're glad you are here and welcome also The Rev. Dr. Christy Lang Hearlson as our guest preacher today. You can read Christy's bio below. She is a leading thinker and writer on children and spirituality and we welcome her both in worship and to lead our Adult Forum after worship. Using the texts from Exodus and Matthew, Christy will help us to reflect more deeply on how children are part of our worshipping community, and how we might better welcome them as not just "future" but as "present" members of our church family! We pray that you (and all our children) will be spiritually refreshed and socially reoriented for the week ahead.

Adult Forum Topic: Let the Little Children Be Bored?

Have you ever heard a child complain that church is boring? While some ministry experts claim it is a sin to bore a kid in church, others say we should let our chronically overstimulated children experience boredom. What should adults do? Make church more entertaining? Tell kids to embrace their boredom? Before we act, perhaps we should try to understand what causes children's boredom—and what prompts children to engage. Dr. Christy Lang Hearlson, an award-winning professor in the department of Theology and Religious Studies at Villanova University, will help us investigate what our children's boredom is telling us—and what we can do about it.



Rev. Dr. Christy Lang Hearlson is Associate Professor of Religious and Theological Education at Villanova University. Originally from Washington State, she served as Associate Pastor at The Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City from 2005-2010 and then earned a PhD in Practical Theology and Christian education from Princeton Theological Seminary (2016). She has co-edited a volume on youth ministry and theological education and published essays on pedagogy in theological education, children's spirituality, and ecological spirituality. At Villanova, she helped establish the Heart of Teaching program, which trains graduate students to be excellent teachers and leaders, and in which she teaches courses on pedagogy. She teaches additional courses on children's spiritual lives, the spirituality of attention, water and Christian theology, and ecology and spirituality. She has received two awards at Villanova for her teaching, the 2022 Junior Faculty Excellence in Teaching Award and the 2023 Grace Adolphsen Brame Trust Faculty Award. She is currently co-directing the Children, Liturgy, Ecology, and Renewal (CLEAR) Project, funded with a \$1.25 million grant from the Lilly Endowment. Christy lives near Philadelphia with her spouse, Rev. Dr. Adam Hearlson, and their two young sons. She is an avid gardener and wishes it would rain in Pennsylvania.

ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

Today's organ music is composed by **Charles-Marie Widor**. French organist, composer and teacher Charles-Marie Widor was born in Lyon on 21 February 1844. His family were organ builders, and he studied initially with his father, then moved to Brussels for organ tuition with Jacques-Nicolas Lemmens and composition studies with François-Joseph Fétis. He then moved to Paris, where, a year later, he became Organist at Saint-Sulpice. He also travelled internationally as one of the world's leading organists. As a composer, Widor wrote operas, a ballet, orchestral works, songs and choral works, and chamber and piano music. He's best known for his organ music, and in particular for his ten organ symphonies. For six years he was organ professor at the Paris Conservatoire, and then became Composition Professor, where his students included Marcel Dupré, Darius Milhaud, Charles Tournemire, Edgard Varèse and Louis Vierne. He also co-founded the American Conservatory at Fontainebleau in 1921 and was its director until 1934. Widor died at home in Paris on 12 March 1937, aged ninety-three.

Our FPCNC Choir anthem is arranged by **Dan Forrest** (b. 1978). Dan's work ranges from small choral works to instrumental solo works, wind ensemble works, and extended multi-movement works for chorus and orchestra. His Requiem for the Living (2013) and Jubilate Deo (2016) have become standard choral/orchestral repertoire for ensembles around the world. Dan holds a doctorate in composition and a master's degree in piano performance, and served for several years as a professor and department head (music theory and composition) in higher education. He currently serves as Editor at Beckenhorst Press, Chair of the American Choral Director's Association Composition Initiatives Committee, adjunct Faculty at Furman University, and Artist-In-Residence at Mitchell Road Presbyterian Church (Greenville, SC).

Bass, Devin Mitchell sings music for our offertory composed by **Margaret Bonds** (1913-1972). Her mother, Estella Bonds, was a trained musician who taught piano and served as church choral director and organist. Margaret began studying piano with her mother at a very early age. By the time she reached age eight, she had progressed to studying at the Coleridge-Taylor Music School. Eventually, she studied composition with Florence Price and William Dawson. In 1929, she was admitted to Northwestern University, where she was allowed to study but not to live or use their facilities. She received her master's degree in music from Northwestern in 1934. That same year, she became the first African American to perform with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and she was the featured pianist for the Woman's Symphony Orchestra of Chicago's performance of Price's Piano Concerto in D Minor. Bonds continued refining her skills as a composer. She also made a living by teaching piano to area students, including ten-year-old Ned Rorem. Bonds relocated to New York in 1939. Bonds also studied composition privately with famed composer Roy Harris and piano with Diane Herz at Julliard. During the 1950's, Bonds composed a number of works using the poems of Langston Hughes–whom she had finally met in 1936 and with whom she become close friends over the years. One of Bonds' most well-known settings was *He's Got the Whole World in His Hand* – heard this morning, and commissioned by and composed for Leontyne Price in 1963.


ONGOING PROGRAMS



The next New Covenant House volunteer day will be Saturday, November 2 and the FPC Staff will be prepping food and serving meals that day.






