TODAY IN WORSHIP

Welcome to Worship on this Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week and the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Today we are reflecting on what kind of King Jesus claimed to be, and why the strange manner of riding on two donkeys Matthew records. Through the gospel lesson and the passage from Zechariah, we will wrestle with what it means to claim Jesus as Lord today, and why this day begins what is called Jesus' Passion. We are glad you are worshipping with us, and pray you will experience the grace of God's welcome and be spiritually refreshed and socially reoriented for this Holy Week.

Sunday School! Join us as we explore Bible stories and all our questions about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and the world around us. We will explore these themes through discussion, crafts, music, and other visual media. Children begin Worship in the Sanctuary with their families then following the Blessing for Young Disciples, we move to our Sunday School classes upstairs in the Bliss House and then return to the Sanctuary towards the end of Worship.

Children are warmly welcome to stay in Worship! For children who stay during Worship, the **Pray-Ground** can be found in the area in front of the back pew bench. The Pray-Ground is a designated place in the Sanctuary where young children can experience worship through age-appropriate worship materials and tools that will help keep them engaged in what is happening. We will continue to rotate books and coloring materials on an ongoing basis. Although it can seem counter-intuitive to adults, children are often able to process what they hear more effectively when they have something to do with their hands.

Any child worshipping in the Pray-Ground should bring their grown-up with them to the Pray-Ground. Including young children in worship can sometimes feel a little daunting, especially on days when they're feeling a little extra fidgety, but we don't need to be discouraged from keeping children in the Sanctuary. There are many important things that children learn while in Worship, even when we're not sure if they're paying attention. Young children learn by observing the adults around them. Children acquire the "language" of worship by listening to and observing the words the adults around them say, much like how they learn their native tongue. Quite simply, children learn to worship by regularly being in Worship. **So families with little ones should feel free to worship together in the Pray-Ground!**

FPCNC also offers childcare during our Sunday Service provided by Saturnina Greaves and Lizz Reyes from Wee Care Nanny Agency. Our Nursery is located just off our Common Room vestibule down the long hall from the Sanctuary and is available between the hours of 8:45–11:30am. **Parental and guardian sign-in is required and we do ask that you pick up your child promptly after the Service.**

Have a prayer request? Prayer Cards are located in the back of the church adjacent to the Sanctuary entrance. Before worship, please give the completed Prayer Card to either Scott, Mary or one of the Ushers. These requests will be included in our Prayers of the People for that Sunday. You will have the option to exclude your prayer from the communal prayer if you prefer. All prayers will be held and prayed over in confidence. ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning, our English Handbell Choir rings during our prelude music by **Mary Gilkeson McCleary** (1920-2017). She was an accomplished organist, pianist, and handbell musician and enjoyed a long, rich career in music ministry. Mrs. McCleary graduated as valedictorian from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ, earning a Bachelor of Music in 1941. Her first position was Organist-Director at The Congregational Church of Naugatuck, CT where she served over thirty years. She also served in music ministry at the Congregational Church, Painesville, OH, the First Baptist Church, Waterbury, CT, the United Church of Christ, Southbury, CT, and the First Congregational Church, Watertown, CT. She was a well-known, popular composer of music for handbells and served as the Chairman of Area I of the New England Guild of English Handbell Ringers when it merged with the newly formed American Guild. This made her the first Chairman of Area I of the AGEHR, Inc. She served as the Chairman for four years and then became President of the National organization (1979-81). She led workshops and seminars and conducted handbell festivals in the United States, Canada and Japan. She also had served as Dean of the Waterbury Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Our FPCNC Choir's anthem is composed by **Georg Philipp Telemann** (1681-1767), a German Baroque composer and multi-instrumentalist. He is one of the most prolific composers in history, at least in terms of surviving works. Telemann was considered by his contemporaries to be one of the leading German composers of the time, and he was compared favourably both to his friend Johann Sebastian Bach, who made Telemann the godfather and namesake of his son Carl Philipp Emanuel, and to George Frideric Handel, whom Telemann also knew personally. Almost completely self-taught in music, he became a composer against his family's wishes. He held important positions in Leipzig, Sorau, Eisenach, and Frankfurt before settling in Hamburg in 1721, where he became Musical Director of that city's five main churches. As part of his duties, he wrote a considerable amount of music for educating organists under his direction. This includes 48 chorale preludes and 20 small fugues (modal fugues) to accompany his chorale harmonisations for 500 hymns. His music incorporates French, Italian, and German national styles, and he was at times even influenced by Polish popular music. He remained at the forefront of all new musical tendencies, and his music stands as an important link between the late Baroque and early Classical styles. The Telemann Museum in Hamburg is dedicated to him.

Our offertory anthem is music composed by **Jack Herman Ossewaarde** (1918-2004). Jack Ossewaarde was the Organist of New York City's Calvary Episcopal Church from 1948 (following Harold Friedell when HF went to St. Bartholomew's) until 1953 when he left for Houston to be Organist and Choirmaster of Christ Church Cathedral and Organist and Program Annotator of the Houston Symphony Orchestra under Leopold Stowkowski. When Friedell died in 1958, the Rev. Terence J. Finlay, Rector of St. Bartholomew's, called Ossewaarde to succeed Friedell again, and he stayed at St. Bartholomew's for 24 years until he retired in 1982. He lived in Stamford, Conn., and was the Conductor of the Greenwich Choral Society for several years early in his New York tenure. In his retirement he substituted for several local churches, including Christ's Church in Rye, New York, and Saint Luke's Parish in Darien, Conn.

Our organ postlude is composed by **Frederick Karam** (1926-1978), organist, choir conductor, trombonist, singer, and teacher. Bachelor of Music (Toronto) 1950, Associate of the Royal Conservatory of Music (1950), Doctor of Music (Toronto) 1953. He went to school in Ottawa, then studied at the University of Toronto and at the Toronto Conservatory of Music with Gerald Bales, S. Drummond Wolff, and Healey Willan. For his doctorate he submitted his cantata for choir and orchestra, *Lazarus*. He was Organist-Choirmaster 1950-78 at St Elijah Syrian Orthodox Church in Ottawa, and conducted 1955-65 the Ottawa Choral Society and, for eight years, an Ottawa Canadian Broadcasting Corporation orchestra. He also directed the Toronto Opera Lovers' Group and gave theory and voice lessons. He taught harmony/counterpoint, composition, and voice 1962-78 at the University of Ottawa, and when the Music Dept was established there in 1969 he took on the position of Academic Secretary. His compositions include Modal Trumpet, heard this morning; Poem for Strings, Scherzo for piano, and; for organ, Gigue and Divertimento. He also wrote a ballet for children and the sound tracks for three films.
